

CAP Directors Report December 12, 2016

Youth Center

During the month of November the Youth Center has had 47 different students attend, with a daily average of 15 students. The decline in daily average is likely attributed to the boy's middle school basketball. Girl's middle school basketball season will start in December and likely numbers may again be affected.

Seniors

November there was only one luncheon hosted due to the Thanksgiving Holiday. A musical performance was provided by Bill Hill with an attendance of 17 seniors. Upcoming December events will include a concert by the Utica Christian School Choir.

Park

Holiday lights are up and running as of the weekend after the Thanksgiving Holiday. Lights are on nightly from 5pm -10pm, and donations are appreciated as patrons tour the park. Chad has recently created a disc golf course improvement plan that outlines priorities and projects related to the disc golf course. Chad is working to meet with a Madison area disc golf vendor and other local enthusiasts in the winter months to refine the plan with potential for an event at the park to raise funds for the projects.

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry averaged 27 families in November. Nancy and her volunteers handed out 77 Thanksgiving Baskets and also held a free clothing give-away for Food Pantry Clients on November 16. The CHS National Honor Society and DECA brought in 837 pounds of items food that they collected during "Trick-or-Canning." Additionally, the CES second graders collected 287 pounds of food in November.

Community Café

The Cambridge School District served barbeques and macaroni and cheese to 251 individuals on December 1. It was a festive evening enjoyed by all!
