CAP Directors Report

December 2017

Youth Center

47 different students attended the Youth Center during the month of December, with a daily average being 16 students. Since January 1, 2017 the Youth Center has served 124 unduplicated students. For the third month in a row, the Youth Center has seen steady attendance, even with Science Olympiad, Girls Middle School Basketball, and CAP Boys Basketball. Unfortunately, the schools out sessions on 12/22 and 12/29 were cancelled due to low enrollment. For the summer, the Youth Center will be offering a one day a week camp, hosted on Fridays that includes day trip. These trips will coincide with CAP CARE.

Park

As of January 1, the Holiday Lights Display is officially shut off from daily operations. The final donation estimate was between \$75 and \$100 in individual giving. Looking to the upcoming park season, Chad has reached out to past shelter rentals to secure 2018 bookings. Additionally, he has also been working to get new season passes made and marketed to the community.

Seniors

26 seniors enjoyed a ham meal and listening to Christmas music by Nikolay Middle School Choir members for the December senior luncheon.

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry saw 104 households to which included 180 adults and 74 children in the month of December. The Food Pantry was closed the week of Christmas but Nancy made arrangements to allow any household needing assistance to stop by the Thursday before Christmas.

Lake Ripley 4-H helped assemble 84 Christmas Ham Baskets that were handed out along with Christmas gifts in lighthouse room for individuals to pick out items for members of their households.

Nikolay Middle School students collected 250 pounds of food to which the Pantry is very thankful for.

Nancy attended the Jefferson County Coalition meeting in December. Out of the 8 Pantries represented, 3 saw an increase in usage over the past couple of months. (including Cambridge).

77 Blue Jay Backpacks were delivered to Cambridge School District students in December.

Community Café

The Community Cafe was hosted by the Cambridge School District staff and served 228 individuals. The meal of mac n' cheese and BBQ was very well received.

CAP CARE is currently full with 57 students enrolled and has a wait list of 9 children.

During the month of December, CAP CARE began preparations for summer day camp and the planning 11 weeks of trips/activities with the help from the kids in our program. Day Camp will be working with the Youth Center this summer on the weekly trips. The goal is to help build up excitement for attending the Youth Center in 5th grade.

Preparations are also being made for the upcoming 4K Child Development Days and registration for 2018-19 4K wrap around care program. Registration is set to officially open on February 1st. Cap Care currently have an interest list of 5, 4K students, with 2 of them having older siblings waiting to get into our program. We can currently enroll 13 new 4K students with one teacher, but are hoping to have 16 students to allow us to offer more hours for an additional teacher and maxing our program out at 18. Child Development Days will be held on Friday, February 16th.
