

## **CAP Directors Report**

*February 2019*

### **Adult Athletics**

Endure has continued to run strongly through February. We are taking registration for Pilates which begins the first week of March.

### **Aquatics**

24 members renewed or purchased passes/memberships in the month of February. Pool Deck Yoga kicked off on February 14 and had great feedback! This is the first session with currently 13 registered for the program. Over 200 swimmers from 6 teams participated in the Blue Fins annual Sweetheart Swim meet on February 2.

### **CAP CARE**

In February, CAP CARE attended Child Development Days which led to 15 4k children enrolled for the 2019-2020 school year. CAP CARE also had 2 parents approach us and ask to be on the 4K interest list for the 2020-2021 school year. There are currently 14 children on the waiting list, 5 of whom are waiting to get on for the 2019-2020 school year.

CAP CARE has begun advertising for our annual bake sale. This will be held on Thursday, March 21<sup>st</sup> during the Kindergarten & 1<sup>st</sup> grade concert. This year CAP CARE would like to purchase additional art supplies with the proceeds.

CAP CARE will be hosting the Region 2 WCCAA meeting in April. Directors from Region 2 will be coming to Cambridge and CAP CARE to check out our facility then stay for a meeting where we will be hosting a Dementia training.

### **Community Café**

The Community Cafe was cancelled in February due to the weather.

### **Food Pantry**

The Food Pantry served 118 households to which included 190 adults and 113 children in the month of February. 77 Blue Jay backpacks were distributed in February as well. Nancy attended the Hometown Bank donation breakfast on February 21 and received a nice check in support of the Food Pantry.
