

CAP Directors Report

June 2019

Adult Athletics

Pilates and Jazzercise continue to run successfully throughout the summer.

Aquatics

11 members renewed or purchased passes/memberships in the month of June. Breezeway Bubbles LLC - (Scuba) has scheduled 4 more rentals for the summer to which average \$400 per rental.

CAP CARE

Day Camp is in full swing now. Both Lollipop Lane and 34th street are full for 4 of the 11 weeks. Day camp visited the Fort Hospital sim lab, Milton House Inn and Sky Zone during the first few weeks of camp.

Two more of the newest staff members, August and Nicole, completed their shadow shifts and have been working regularly each week. Meghan and Jen will be finishing up their Intro to Childcare certifications in July.

In June, CAP CARE also had a state inspection. During this inspection, there were no violations found. CAP CARE has submitted a request to be considered to include 3 year old children. This would allow CAP CARE to take early childhood students if space is available after families. This change would take effect the 2020-2021 school year if approved.

Community Café

The Community Cafe was hosted by the Hometown Bank in June and served 320 individuals a wonderful cookout.

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry served 114 households to which included 198 adults and 93 children in the month of June. This is a standard increase annually for the time of year.

Ripley Park

The weather didn't cooperate as nicely as the park would have liked in June. However, the shelter reservations increased overall and the shelters have been filled most weekends. Park operations are running smoothly and everything is looking great.

Seniors

The first meal was on June 12 and served 18 seniors chicken alfredo while playing Bingo. On June 26, 17 seniors enjoyed grilled brats and hamburgers, baked beans, cole slaw and ice cream at Ripley Park.

Youth Athletics

The Little League tournament hosted 11 teams, and totaled around 300+ attendants/players. Total profits doubled from last year with the great food/beverage donations from our sponsors and parents (\$1400). Our first session of tennis also started and produced decent numbers for the month and hopefully will attract additional for our second session starting July 25th.

Youth Center

The Youth Center is closed for the summer. Jordan has been brainstorming new fundraising ideas for the 2019-2020 school year.

Youth Enrichment

Art & Play (preschool program) is seeing great numbers for the summer. The first two sessions met in June and the rest of the sessions for the summer are full!
